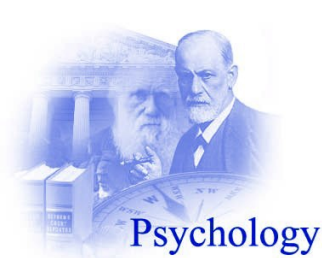


Social Sciences - Psychology
