

Dillard University Student Achievement Report

2022

Dillard University evaluates success with respect to student achievement in a manner consistent with its mission, which is to cultivate leaders who live ethically, think and communicate precisely, and act courageously to make the world a better place. In particular, Dillard measures student achievement in three different areas:

I. Retention and Graduation Rates

SACSCOC Key Completion Indicator: National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) Total 6-year Completion Rate

Threshold of Acceptability: The institution's 6-year completion rate will exceed the 6-year completion rate of African American/black students at all institutions.

Goal: The institution's 6-year completion rate will approach the completion rate of African American/black students at private 4-year nonprofit institutions.

The Fall Enrollment 2021 IPEDS data submission indicates that African American/black students make up 94.5% of Dillard University's student population for whom race is known. Thus, the NSC 6-year completion rates for African American/black students stand as important indicators of Dillard's student success.

Goal: The institution's 6-year graduation rate will approach the 75th percentile marker for 6-year graduation rate across all Private Not-for-Profit Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) with Master-level degree or below as the highest offering (38 institutions).

University Goal 3: Nursing Graduation Rate

Dillard University College of Nursing (DUCON) has established expected level of achievements (ELA) that are consistent with the expectations of the University and the Louisiana State Board of Nursing (LSBN) and the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).

Expected level of achievement:

Forty percent (40%) of the students who begin in Nur 214 Introduction to Nursing in the generic program option will complete the program on time which is six (6) academic terms.

Forty percent (40%) of the students who begin in NUR 218 Health Assessment in the LPN-BSN program option will complete the program on time which is six (6) academic terms.

University Goal 4: Nursing Retention Rate

Dillard University College of Nursing (DUCON) has established expected level of achievements (ELA) that are consistent with the expectations of the University and the Louisiana State Board of Nursing (LSBN) and the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).

Expected level of achievement: The College of Nursing's first year retention rate will exceed 70% (based on the input from faculty, the LSBN Education Committee, and external consultants).

III. Licensure Exams

University Goal 6: NCLEX-RN Licensure Exam

Expected level of achievement: Eighty percent (80%) of candidates who write the NCLEX-RN within a calendar year will pass the exam on the first attempt.

Expected level of achievement: Seventy percent (70%) of the graduation cohort who meet completion rate requirements for a given year will have employment as a registered nurse six-months post-graduation.
